Murder suspect's trial postponed until March
The murder trial of Brian Zirtzman, 39, of Cedar Rapids, who is accused of setting a house fire in which two neighbors died, has been rescheduled to March 8.
Zirtzman's trial had been slated to begin Dec. 8, but last week the court granted a defense motion to reschedule.
The court also ordered that a vial of Zirtzman's blood be drawn and turned over to his attorneys for DNA testing at an alternative facility.
Zirtzman is in the Linn County Jail facing two counts of first-degree murder for setting the April 6 fire at 3755 H Ave. NE that killed Jay Grahlman, 38, and his 6-year-old daughter, Jaymie. Four other family members escaped the fire.
Prosecutors allege Zirtzman set the fire so he could save the family, whom he visited frequently. That plan went awry when the flames spread too quickly.
Gas leak prompts officials to block street

Firefighters were called to 1537 First Ave. E just after 3 p.m. for a report of a natural gas leak in a business, department spokesman Dave Koch said.

No injuries were reported.
