"People will not be walking out of the polls and saying, 'Did I really vote for school board?' It will all come up screen by screen," she says.

Acclimating voters to the new system has been a gradual process for Gibson and Crimmins. To date, they have taken the system to 45 locations in the county, including Lewis Cass High School where some voters will cast their first votes next year on the new system.


"The response that we're getting from people after they use it is, 'Gee, is that all there is to that," Gibson says.

Touchscreen voting also should make for a quick election to count, Gibson

says. "I'm saying I'm going to be home in time to watch 'Jeopardy.' I think everything will be over with well before 7 o'clock!

According to Voting Technologies, the machines are certified to meet or exceed Federal Election Commission standards, as well as National Association of State Election Directors standards. The product was initiated by Anthony Boldin, president and CEO of the company, who was disappointed by the controversies


