Women send Gore gives up Tate trial into uproar
WASHINGTON (UPI) — The Senate broke one legislative deadline today but there still appeared to be virtually no chance that the 91st Congress could complete its work before the Jan. 3 constitutional deadline.

The first obstacle overcome of several remaining required when lame duck Sen. Albert Gore, D-Tenn., compromised with the White House and gave up his on-and-off filibuster against the \$2.7 billion foreign aid authorization bill.

The measure then passed by the Senate by voice vote, and now goes to the House, which voted \$3.7 billion and has the option of accepting the Senate version or sending it to a joint conference committee.
