

## She posed nude for Playboy Photos cause withdrawal from pageant

IOWA CITY (AP) — A candidate in a preliminary competition for the Miss Iowa pageant has withdrawn because she appears nude in the September issue of Playboy Magazine.

She's one of six University of Iowa coeds who are pictured in the magazine's "Girls of the Big 10" photo layout.

Linnette Postel, of Davenport, is one of four Iowa women who appear without clothing.

Postel, a therapeutic recreation major at the U of I, Friday withdrew from the Miss Valley Fair pageant, scheduled for Sunday. The pageant is a preliminary to the Miss Iowa contest.

In a statement, Postel said, "The recent adverse publicity given to the Miss America contestant has apparently rubbed off on me and my family."

Vanessa Williams resigned her Miss American title earlier this week after nude photographs of her appeared in Penthouse Magazine.

Postel was a U of I sophomore last year. She is pictured in Playboy with soapbuds, but not with clothing. She was paid \$300 for her poses.

Postel said she was told she would appear only semi-nude in the magazine, and decided to withdraw rather than jeopardize the Miss Iowa contest. The winner of the Miss Iowa contest competes in the Miss America pageant.

There is no morals clause for

contestants in the Miss Valley Fair contest, but the Miss Iowa contest does have such a clause for contestants.

Miss Iowa pageant executive director Dave Maslowski of Davenport says if Postel won the Miss Valley Fair contest, she would be excluded from the Miss Iowa pageant because of the Playboy photos.

Playboy's September issue is due on newsstands next Tuesday.

The six Iowans are among 32 women featured in the magazine's 10-page pictorial, which includes women from all of the Big Ten schools.

Iowa and Ohio State have more women in the issue than the other Big Ten schools.

The magazine predicts, in an accompanying story, that the Hawkeye football team will wind up sixth in the Big Ten race with a record of 7-5.

A Playboy press release says the six women will take part in a promotional tour to meet the public and autograph copies of the magazine in Des Moines, Cedar Rapids, Iowa City and Davenport.

But not all of the U of I women pictured will participate in the promotion and not all are smiling about the issue.

Christine Penniman of Des Moines, a freshman last year, found out about three weeks ago that she would appear nude, leaning against a porch swing.

"It's totally disgusting. It's not what we agreed upon," she said. Her mother said Penniman will not autograph any magazines.

Sherry Klemesrud, a sophomore from Sterling, Ill., last school year, appeared as a "barn-burner." She's wearing only tennis shoes in her hayloft pose.

Molly Neuenswander, a freshman from Burlington, is shown without clothes on a bed nibbling on a slice of orange.

Elizabeth McDowell and Stefanie Krug, both of Iowa City, are among those women who were shown dressed in the pictorial. They were photographed on the Iowa River bank while attending a fraternity party last spring.

McDowell and Krug received \$75 each. The unclothed women received \$300 each.

## Risken seeks to bar public from hearing

DES MOINES (AP) — A West Des Moines man, charged with trying to hire a hit man to kill a labor leader, is asking that the public be barred from a hearing next week involving evidence to be used at his trial.

Louis Risken, 62, president of the International Insurance Agencies Inc., has pleaded innocent to four charges related to his alleged attempt to hire someone to kill Vernon Bennett, president of Teamsters Local 147 in Des Moines. Risken contends he is being framed.

Risken has been administrator of the union's health and welfare plan and Bennett has been a witness before a federal grand jury investigating the local union's affairs.

Risken's attorney, Philip Miller, filed court papers Thursday seeking to prevent government prosecutors

from using tape recordings, wire intercepts or statements obtained through eavesdropping. He contends the evidence is inadmissible in trial, although the court papers do not say why the statements cannot be told to a jury.

Prosecutors have not responded to the requests and details of the wire taps have not been disclosed.

U.S. District Judge Harold Vietor has set a hearing on Miller's requests for Wednesday. Miller wants the public excluded because he said detailed testimony concerning the evidence might result in overwhelming adverse pretrial publicity and he doesn't want potential jurors told "adverse information."

Miller also wants the trial moved to another judicial district and delayed until after Jan. 1.

## Suspect's description released

DES MOINES (AP) — The Iowa Division of Criminal Investigation on Thursday released a detailed description of a man seen driving a car owned by a man found stabbed to death.

The man is sought in connection with the stabbing death of Arnold Sansgaard, whose body was found Saturday in his rural Story County home. The man was seen driving Sansgaard's car 50 miles north of Minneapolis on July 16. The car was later found in Effingham, Ill.

He is described as 6-foot-2-inches

tall, about 37 years old, weighing 170 pounds, with medium-length dark brown hair, clean-shaven and possibly wearing glasses, the DCI said. He has severe burn scars on his right arm, forearm and neck area and possibly on his left arm.

The suspect was stopped near Minneapolis after the car was seen weaving, and issued a routine traffic warning, officers said. At the time, Sansgaard's relatives were unaware he was dead and the car had not been reported missing.

## 13-year-old Milo boy dies from farm accident injuries

SANDYVILLE, Iowa (AP) — A 13-year-old rural Milo boy has died from injuries received when the skidloader he was operating overturned and rolled into a ditch on a gravel road less than one-half mile south of the Warren County community of Sandyville.

The youth, Edward Coggeshall, died in a hospital Wednesday night. He was the son of Paul and Sandra Coggeshall.

An Iowa State Patrol spokesman said the accident occurred Wednesday evening as Coggeshall apparently was returning to his home. The spokesman said the boy was driving on the shoulder of the road when he lost control of the vehicle, which is equipped with a scoop attachment on the front.

Authorities said Coggeshall either fell from the vehicle or jumped just before it rolled on top of him. Hospital officials say the boy received head and chest injuries in the accident.

## Webster City man, 22, killed in 2-vehicle traffic accident

WEBSTER CITY, Iowa (AP) — A 22-year-old Webster City man, Bradley J. Grant, was killed in a two-vehicle crash Wednesday on a Hamilton County road 4½ miles north of Webster City.

Authorities said Grant was a passenger in a car driven by Danelle Stephenson, 22, of Webster City that collided with a pickup truck driven by Anthony Nessa, 24, of rural Woolstock. The crash occurred about 6:30 p.m.

Stephenson suffered a fractured

arm and leg. She was transferred to an Ames hospital after treatment at Webster City. Investigators said Grant and Stephenson were wearing seat belts.

Nessa was not seriously injured.
