soybean futures came under heavy selling pressure Monday, closing with a loss of \$14 cents. Wheat futures also were irreg-ular after first losing 6 cents then advancing 4% cents above the previous close. Corn gained

more than 4 cents and oats prices were mixed.

The weakness in the new crep soybean futures was apparent on the opening. Much of the swing was attributed to a survey by the American Soybean Assn., that indicated farmers planned \$2.5 million acres into soybeans this year, 6 million acres more than last year.

Old crop soybeans fell 12 early under apparent speculative selling and profit taking by recent longs.

At the close, soybeans were down up to 812 cents, March 6.61; wheat was mixed, March 2.4315; corn was up some 4 cents, March 1.6812 and oats were mostly lower, March 85%
