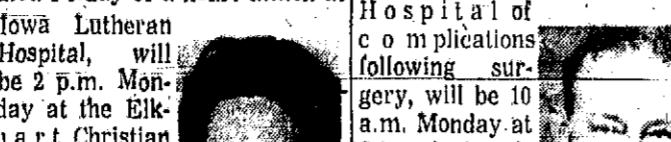

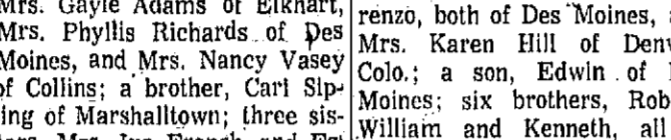


Prayer services will be at 8 p.m. Sunday at the Elkhart church.
