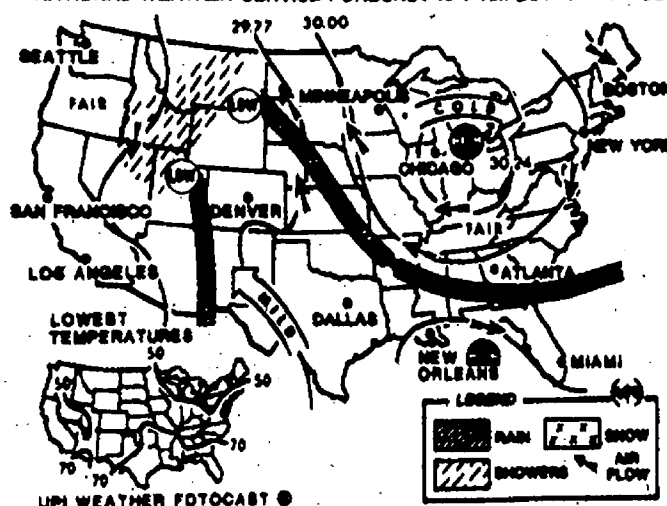

# GH State Police Post joins Iowa slaying probe

COUNCIL BLUFFS, Iowa (UPI) — Police Chief Ed Dinovo said Tuesday Michigan state police post in Grand Haven had joined the investigation into the stabbing death of a Michigan woman whose body was found in a Council Bluffs motel room last week.

Dr. Samuel Rosa, Pottawattamie County medical examiner, has said Lee Rotatoria, 31, Nunica, Mich., died from a single knife wound in the heart, inflicted from the front.

Dinovo said Michigan investigators were checking Mrs. Rotatoria's background.

Rosa Monday said Mrs. Rotatori may have been dead about 12 hours before her body was found Friday in her room at the Village Inn Motel.

Rosa said the death "could have been sexually motivated", but police Capt. Eldon Jones said no conclusive evidence has been garnered to support that theory.

Jones said there were "no solid leads" in the case. Mrs. Rotatori apparently had been in the area about a week and had started training as a food service manager at Jennie Edmundson Hospital.

Jones said no weapon was found, there were no signs of a struggle and the woman's car was in the motel's parking lot.

Jones said the body, face up on the bed and dressed in sleepwear, was discovered by motel employees.

He said the Mrs. Rotatori was registered alone and not known to be traveling with anyone. He said the woman was married and her husband remained in Michigan when she came to Council Bluffs.

Jones said further autopsy tests were being conducted.
