Larson says he's unsatisfied with U of I work report

Lawmaker will press for more faculty time spent in classrooms

DES MOINES (AP) — A legislative critic Friday said he is not satisfied with a new University of Iowa study that claims liberal arts teachers spend nearly 40 hours a week teaching.

Rep. Chuck Larson, R-Cedar Rapids, noted that the report

found that most of that work week was spent outside the classroom and said he would continue a push to assure that instructors spend time in the classroom with undergraduates.

"In this era of tight budgets, we need to be very cautious about time in the classroom," Larson said.

Larson sparked the dispute last year when he released a study that claimed faculty members spent as little as five hours a week in the classroom teach-

He said that left many students and parents struggling to pay college tuition for an education largely taught by teaching assistants while high-paid faculty spent time doing research or work with graduate students.

His assault stung college officials, who this week offered their own study. The University of Iowa study showed liberal arts faculty members spent 37.4 hours a week teaching students.

those hours were with undergraduates.

By the time other activities were factored in, liberal arts faculty members spent 59 hours a week on the job, according to the study.

But Larson noted the re-

port itself conceded liberal arts faculty members spend an average of 4.6 hours per week in the classroom, and he said that is what is important.

"What concerns me is how much time they are in the class-room teaching," said Larson, an Iowa graduate.

The study said that teaching time for faculty members in all 10 of the schools at the college averages 31.4 hours a week.

Larson said he would continue to push for explanations of faculty workload. Part of his complaint was that the most experienced, tenured teachers who are paid the most spend the least time in the classroom with undergraduates.

College officials said the new study disputes that claim, finding that full professors spend almost as much time in the classroom as do associate and assistant professors.

Hog lot, park officials agree on Tama County confinement

TOLEDO (AP) - Tama County officials say hog-lot owners can build a 1,400-sow operation less than a mile from a park, but there will be some limits.

Tama County Conservation Board members were concerned foul odors from the hog lot would drive away anglers and campers. But Central Iowa Pork and conservation board members believe they have found an amicable solution.

"Essentially, if our facility creates an odor problem, we would be required to put a straw bio-cover over the 1.8-million cement manure pit or add chemical additives to the liquid manure to reduce odors," said Bill Jesina, one of 13 northwest Iowa farmers who are members of Central Iowa Pork. "But we're pretty confident this won't be needed.".

less than a mile from Otter Creek Lake and Park and five miles northeast of Toledo. Otter Creek Lake and Park, built 27 years ago, draws 30,000 to 50,000 visitors a year.

The confinement will be built

According to the agreement, a cover or the additives would be required after 10 or more days of foul odors during the period between May 1 to Oct. 1, or 20 or more days during a full calendar year.

However, Central Iowa Pork is exempt during a four-day period in the fall when the pit is emptied.

Conservation director Bob Etzel said he and his staff will document the foul odors. Odors only have to persist for 90 minutes during a 24-hour period to be counted as one day.

D.M. police reluctant to say slayings are by serial killer

DES MOINES (AP) — Despite similarities in the slayings of three women in Des Moines-area motels, police are reluctant to say the three were the victims of a serial killer.

The three — two in recent months and the third in 1993 were found naked from the waist down and their wrists

John Pless of Indianapolis, the president of the National Association of Medical Examiners, said the similarities should not be underestimated.

"You shouldn't have to have more than three," he said. "When you have three, you should assume you have a serial killer.'

Mariana Redroban, 15, of Ecuador, was stabbed to death in January in a room at the West Des Moines Walnut Creek Inn, where she worked as a house-

keeper. Zurijeta Sakanovic, a 21-yearold Bosnian refugee, was strangled and stabbed to death Sept. 4

at the Clive Budgetel Inn, where she worked. Patricia Lange was found

strangled in her hotel room in West Des Moines in August

Investigators have not said whether Redroban was strangled.

Police say that despite the

similarities, there were also differences and they are reluctant to link the three.

"I personally could not say that" the three are linked, said Capt. Bob Rushing, interim police chief in West Des Moines, where the deaths of Lange and Sakanovic are being investigat-

ISU professor: College students are ringing up unnecessary credit card debt

DES MOINES (AP) — An Iowa State University professor said college students are burdening themselves with extra credit.

Tahira Hira, a professor of human development and family studies, randomly sur-

veyed 665 ISU students last spring.

She found that the average student had three credit cards and a debt on those cards of \$1,027. The charges were not usually for textbooks and school supplies but for things

like clothes, she said. About 80 percent of the respondents said they carried credit cards. About 9 percent said they had more than five. More than half reported buying things they didn't need.


