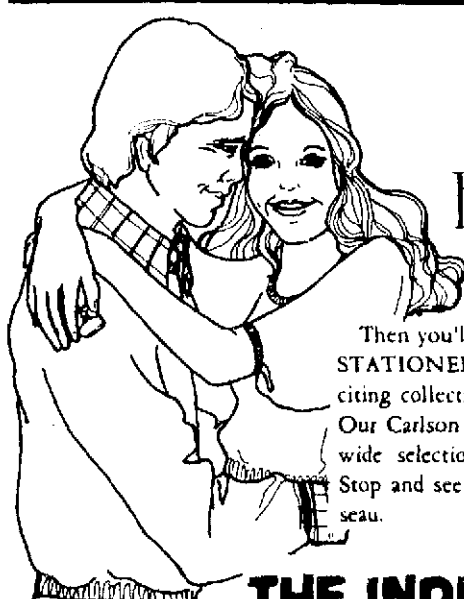
Mr. Gronemeyer's future education goals are to continue his education at S.D.S.U. graduate school and teach vocational education.
