New law suits filed

Q -- When I purchase a home using a Veterans Administration guaranteed home loan, will my wife's income be considered?

A -- Yes. The spouse's income is considered in the same manner as the veteran's income in determining ability to repay the loan.

Q -- My mother receives Veterans Administration dependency and indemnity compensation (DIC) on the basis of my brother's service-connected death. If we place her in a nursing home, will she forfeit her DIC?

A -- No. In fact, she may be entitled to an additional monthly payment if she become a patient in a nursing home, is helpless or blind, or requires the regular aid and attendance of another person.

Q -- 1 was previously medically qualified or Veterans Administration pension but was denied due to exessive income. How do 1 reopen my claim now that my income has been reduced?

A -- Veterans who wish to reopen their claim for pension should complete a statement of income, employment, and net worth, which can be obtained at any VA regional office or medical center.
