

British theologian to speak at NW

The Rev. Dr. Michael Wilcock of Bristol, England, will be a guest speaker at Northwestern College from Monday, Sept. 20, through Wednesday, Sept. 22.

Dr. Wilcock will speak in chapel at 9:45 a.m., Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, on the topic, "The Pathway to Discipleship."

He will also speak on Monday at 11:15 a.m. in Van Peursem Hall, Room 126, on "Evangelical Christianity: A Problem or Solution in Western Society?". He will speak again on Monday afternoon at 2:15 in Van Peursem Hall, Room 111, on "The Ethos of Anglicanism."

On Tuesday Dr. Wilcock will

speaking at 8:40 and 10:15 on the topic, "Pentecost," in Van Peursem Hall, Room 119. Tuesday afternoon he will hold a seminar on preaching for area pastors at 1:30 p.m. in Bogaard Theatre of the Rowenhurst Student Center. Then, Tuesday evening at 7:30 Dr. Wilcock will present a lecture, "Three Kings," in Bogaard Theatre.

Dr. Wilcock is considered one of the leading evangelical theologians in the Anglican Church. The Reverend Louis Benis of the First Reformed Church in Sheldon said, "Dr. Wilcock is one of the best people ministers in the area will hear speak on preaching in this decade."

The public is invited to attend all of Dr. Wilcock's lectures.

help state and local authorities investigate the apparent accidental shooting of Lisa Vander Esch.

Vander Esch was killed when a rifle discharged accidentally.

Vander Esch dies in shooting

Lisa Vander Esch, 19, Ireton, was killed early Tuesday evening from a bullet to the head after a rifle discharged, according to the Sioux County Sheriff's office.

Authorities said Vander Esch was killed when a rifle discharged while she was playing with their 18-month son, Darwin Vafder Esch, Ireton, told authorities that his rifle accidentally discharged.

Vander Esch reported the incident to authorities shortly after it happened. Authorities from the sheriff's office and Iowa Highway Patrol arrived at the Vander Esch residence 4 1/4 miles southwest of Ireton between 7:30 and 7:45 p.m. Tuesday evening.

Authorities had planned to perform an autopsy on Vander Esch

Wednesday afternoon. Results of the autopsy are not known at this time.

The Sioux County attorney and sheriff's office plus agents from the Department of Criminal Investigation are conducting the investigation.

Law enforcement personnel from

the sheriff's office and DCI stayed at the Vander Esch residence around the clock after the incident.

A conference was planned to be held in the sheriff's office with DCI and county authorities Thursday morning to discuss the incident.

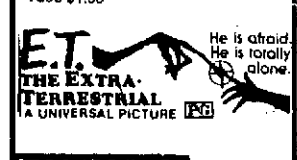
