# **Dico trims first half** expenses; profits rise

\$14.1 million, down 9 per cent from \$15.5 million a year ago.

Total costs and expenses in the latest period were reduced 10 per cent to \$12.9 million from \$14.3 million a year ago, the report showed.

Dico said there were 158,735 fewer common shares outstanding at the end of the latest period, compared with a year ago as a result of the company's continuing program of purchasing Dico shares for retirement. On Feb. 29, 1976, the company said it had 5,970,128 common shares outstanding.

Quaker said it received \$8.1 million cash and will receive further payment of \$10 million between Janaury of 1977, and January of 1982.

Quaker previously announced an after-tax provision of \$11.9 million, or 57 cents a share, to write down the Marx assets that were for sale to their estimated realizable value. Quaker said the writeoff provision appears adequate.

Quaker said its Fisher-Price Toys division is not involved in the sale, nor is the company's 56 per cent interest in its Marx operations in Mexico.

### IMF gold auctions

The International Monetary Fund's executive directors reportedly reached agreement to hold eight gold-auction sales a year when the gold sales begin within a few weeks, Dow Jones News Service says.

The IMF plans to sell 25 million ounces of gold over the next four yearsat market-related prices with part of the proceeds going into a new trust for low-interest loans for poorer nations.

The IMF hasn't yet officially announced any details on the forthcoming gold sales and the executive directors of the agency still have to work out various technical questions on how the gold auction sales will be handled.

### Weekly retail sales higher

The Commerce Department said retail sales last week rose 0.3 per cent from the previous week to a seasonally adjusted \$12.58 billion and were \$17 per cent ahead of the comparable-1975 week.




