Aid through the Page County social welfare office was given to 689 persons during October. These persons received a total of \$49,796.

Most of the cases (331) were receiving under the old age assistance program. There were 278 persons involved in aid to dependent children in 79 cases. Sixty-one received medical assistance, 13 for the blind and six for the deaf. - Taylor County reported a total of 284 persons getting aid totaling \$23,165.

Library offers collection of reading about Kennedy

In observance of the first anniversary of the assassination of John F. Kennedy, the public library will have a special display of books written by him, about him before his death, and about him after his death.

In the first category the library has "While England Slept," written in 1940 as a criticism of Great Britain and its failure to see the coming of World War II. "Profiles in Courage" was written in 1954-1955 while he was convalescing from wounds which he received during the war. It is a collection of dramatic profiles of Americans who took difficult and courageous stands at crucial moments in public life. "America The beautiful" is made up of scenes from one coast to the other of our country. Each is commented on by President Kennedy. He uses words which show deep gratitude for America and love and appreciation of our country.

Appreciative of his ability, and character, many have written books about our former president. They are based on his active life and accomplishments. Donovan's "PT 109" concerns Kennedy's experiences in World War II. James Bishop writes on "A Day in the Life of President

Kennedy." Bradlee's "That Special Grace" was first published in Newsweek. Also Lasky's "JFK: The Man and the Myth" Bruce Lee's "Boy's Life of John F. Kennedy," "Portrait" by Jacques Lowe, and "John F. Kennedy" by Hugh Sides.

The two most widely read books since that fateful day last November are "The Torch Is Passed" by the Associated Press and "Four Days" by the United Press International. And finally, "The Warren Commission Report on the Assassination of President John F. Kennedy" is a complete collection of data procured and analyzed by the Warren Commission.

All of these books will be on display for two weeks and are available for your inspection and reading.
