MR AND MRS IVAN JOHNSON spent the week end with Mr and Mrs Charles Johnson at Lincoln, Nebr.

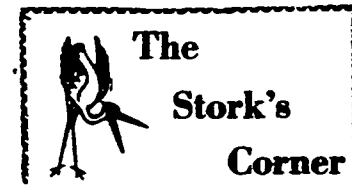

## Davisons are thrown across road

"We just don't know what happened," Mrs. Glenn Davison said this Monday morning after being caught with her husband in their car in the heart of the storm.

They were on their way to the Robert Herzberg home in Yorktown and had just turned south from Highway 2.

"It was raining so hard we could hardly see the corner," she remembers. "I yelled for Glenn to stop the car and he informed me that it was stopped and we were in a violent storm. We swayed from one side of the car to the other hanging on to anything that we could. Once we heard a terrific 'whoosh' which must have been when the Steeve house was leveled."

When the winds subsided the Davisons found their car on the north side of the highway facing back toward Clarinda, at least 100 feet from where it had started. Windshields were smashed and the body of the car badly beaten.
